- Actually BE the community instead of just researching one and the community is automatically centered
- Outcomes we could not have predicted by building the New Voices Cohort:
 - We send out community info and job opportunities to the group and are quickly building the community right into our staff and board more quickly and easily than we could have imagined.
 - Neighbors are already starting to develop their own projects such as building a community garden with neighbors at a local park.
 - They are helping us get the word out about local initiatives directly with friends and neighbors but also on Latino Radio, etc.
