PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

AFTER TWO YEARS OF VIRTUAL GATHERINGS,

RIVER RALLY RETURNED TO AN IN-PERSON EVENT! We gathered in the heart of DC, on the ancestral land of the Nacotchtank (or Anacostan) people, in the nation's capital for a program of engaging speakers and interactive workshops that celebrated wins, illuminated today's most urgent challenges, brought voices forward, and centered equity across all topics.

The excitement for a return to an in-person Rally was palpable, and reminded us of the power, resilience, and positivity of the national network of water protectors. Sharing space once again allowed for renewed connections and a deepening of community, moving us all to new levels of excitement for the work ahead. We are grateful to the speakers who shared their insights and knowledge, the water leaders who gave of their time and energy to attend, our committed sponsors who make this event possible, all attendees for their support of our COVID-19 protocols, and our fabulous staff and board who worked diligently to put on another high value and inspiring event.

ATTENDEES' AHA MOMENTS

The power of trust-based relationships to create meaningful change.

Everything about the "Getting Unstuck" plenary was an aha moment. The focus on the Clean Water Act's 50th anniversary remind[ed] me how important it is to communicate the message of its local impact to our audience.

PLENARY PANEL GETTING UNSTUCK: STEPPING INTO POWER WITH PHILANTHROPY

Most of us struggle to adequately resource our dreams, including those that connect equity to water, people to rivers, and safety to our communities. One approach to getting unstuck is to rethink our relationship to wealth and community. Moderator Ronda Chapman led panelists Melanie Allen, Teresa Davis, Mike Harris, Arthur Johnson, and Tyeshia Wilson in sharing inspiring stories about novel approaches that both democratize philanthropy from the ground up and use trust as a vehicle for shifting power.



KEYNOTE "WE CHOOSE NOW"

Colette Pichon Battle, a generational native of Bayou Liberty, Louisiana, and founder and Executive Director of the Gulf Coast Center for Law & Policy (GCCLP), inspired every corner of the ballroom with her keynote address. She encouraged us all to honor our waters, and explored the connections between water, climate, energy democracy, the movement for Black lives, and more.

PLENARY PANEL DOING BETTER: CLIMATE, WATER & EQUITY AT THE LOCAL LEVEL

The Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act presents a oncein-a-generation opportunity to fix pipes and plumbing and build better infrastructure that delivers clean water, protection from flooding, and climate resiliency in an equitable and just manner. Following prerecorded remarks from Rep. Melanie Stansbury, moderator Andrew Fahlund led panelists Robyn Colosimo, Julian Gonzalez, and Jonathan Nelson in exploring how we avoid the mistakes of the past, how to ensure equitable and sustainable water outcomes, and how you can engage to influence investment near you. Audience members pushed panelists with tough questions on the bureaucracy of government systems and their inherent inequities, encouraging us all to truly 'do better.'

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS WORKSHOPS

River Rally 2022 featured 52 workshops in 6 tracks, with 77% incorporating topics of equity, diversity, inclusion, or justice. From a full slate of State Revolving Fund workshops to a hands-on session where participants made a video from start to finish (*watch it here!*), participants had a wide range of options. The Clean Water Act featured prominently ahead of this year's 50th anniversary, and we were lucky to have many local speakers sharing solutions from the Mid-Atlantic region.

Then, Frank Sirius fired up the crowd with their local go-go sound and the dance party began!

PROGRAM DETAILS ACTION DAY river FOR CLEAN WATER & RIVERS

CLEAN WATER OR ALL ROTECTCLEANWATER

> Following River Rally, we partnered with American Rivers and Waterkeeper Alliance to organize Action Day for Clean Water and Rivers on June 8, an opportunity for water advocates to join together and meet with members of Congress, asking them to support policies that will ensure clean water and healthy rivers for all communities. We trained groups of participants from 17 states and Washington, DC, and helped them schedule virtual and in-person meetings with your members of Congress and key committee staff. These groups headed to the Hill, encouraging lawmakers to strengthen Clean Water Act protections, reduce nutrient pollution, and ensure equitable implementation of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act.
